



Swimming Pool Operational Regulations and Procedures

Season and Operational Hours:

- Operational Days: Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend
- Memorial Day weekend - week before school starts in August: 7 days per week 12 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- The week school starts: Weekends only (Saturday and Sunday) 12 p.m. to 6 p.m.; (these hours may be adjusted due to lifeguard availability).

Admission Fees:

- Daily General Admission: \$4:00 per person.
- Minors under the age of (9) are not permitted without being accompanied by an adult.
 - Unaccompanied minors 9 years of age and older may be permitted after passing a brief swim test AND a parent contact card is completed and signed by the parent/guardian. Children dropped off without a contact card on file WILL NOT be permitted to swim. Contact cards are good for the entire summer. A new contact card will have to be completed each year.
- 30-day pass: \$75:00
 - Passes may be shared with a friend or family member. Card will be punched for EACH entry/individual admission.
 - 30-day passes will not be replaced if lost.
 - 30-day pass holders may leave their pass at the pool office if they choose. Pass holders must give their name and pass number to be admitted.
- An “admission” is defined as one entry for the entire day for which the admission has been purchased from 12:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.
- Temporary leaves (exit and re-entry) for the same day will not be permitted.
- Cash ONLY will be accepted at the pool facility. 30-day passes may be purchased at City Hall by check or credit card.

Private Party Fees:

- Group of 25 or less:
 - \$50/1st hour
 - \$30/each hour thereafter.
- Group of 25 – 50:
 - \$75/1st hour
 - \$40/ each hour thereafter.
- Group of 51 – 75:
 - \$100/1st hour
 - \$50/ each hour thereafter.
- Group of 76 – 100:
 - \$150/1st hour
 - \$75/each hour thereafter.

Private Party Hours:

- 7 days per week until the week school starts:
 - 6:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.
- Beginning the week school starts:
 - Saturday and Sunday: 6:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.
 - Any night that is followed by a school day: 5:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.
(Subject to lifeguard availability)

Private Party Reservations:

- All reservations will be made through City Hall. Reservations may be made beginning May 1 for available private party dates detailed above.
- Deposit (Clean-up) A \$150.00 Refundable Deposit is required no later than one week prior to date of party, failure to pay deposit by this date will result in cancelation of party reservation.

Rules of Conduct by Patrons:

- All City Ordinances and Regulations must be followed. Rules are posted at the pool facility and on the City website.

Concessions:

- Concessions may be operated as a fund raiser by non-profit groups with the following regulations:
 - Non-profit groups must attend an orientation conducted by city staff or volunteer concession management team prior to operating concessions.
 - The sponsor and all participants wishing to operate the concessions must sign a waiver of liability holding the city harmless prior to operation of concessions.

- A supervising adult (over 21 years) must be present at all times. Should no adult be present, the non-profit group forfeits its right to operate concessions for that day or indefinitely.
- There shall be no more than 2 persons working the concessions window at one time due to space constraints. Minor children not working the concession window, and visitors of concession workers are not permitted into the concession stand.
- No city employees including lifeguards shall be allowed to work concessions on scheduled.
- Non-profit groups are responsible for providing all supplies, equipment and materials necessary to operate concessions.
- The non-profit group is responsible for all clean-up and disposal for concession operations. Failure to clean-up results in the non-profit group forfeiting its right to operate concessions.
- If members of the non-profit group wish to use the pool they will be required to pay regular admission.

The Winnsboro City Council approved these operational regulations and procedures by Ordinance Number 976-2018 on April 10, 2018.
